



### **Water Across Curriculum Added to Outreach Offerings**

*Water Across Curriculum* (WAC) is an educational outreach program for K-12 students, developed and presented by the Haggerty Museum of Art. The program offers hands-on workshops and an on-line teachers' curriculum guide featuring work from the Haggerty's permanent collection, designed to address a variety of water-related issues. Students from Marquette's College of Education *Art 2330* class assist art educator Sylvia Peine with the workshops/presentations, giving WAC a dual focus of training education students to integrate the visual arts across curriculum and teaching elementary school students about water-related subject matter. The in-depth curriculum guide and activity book, developed by Dr. Lauralee Guibault (associate professor of chemistry, Alverno College) and Ms. Peine can be used in the classroom before and after the Haggerty presentations.
