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The Basics

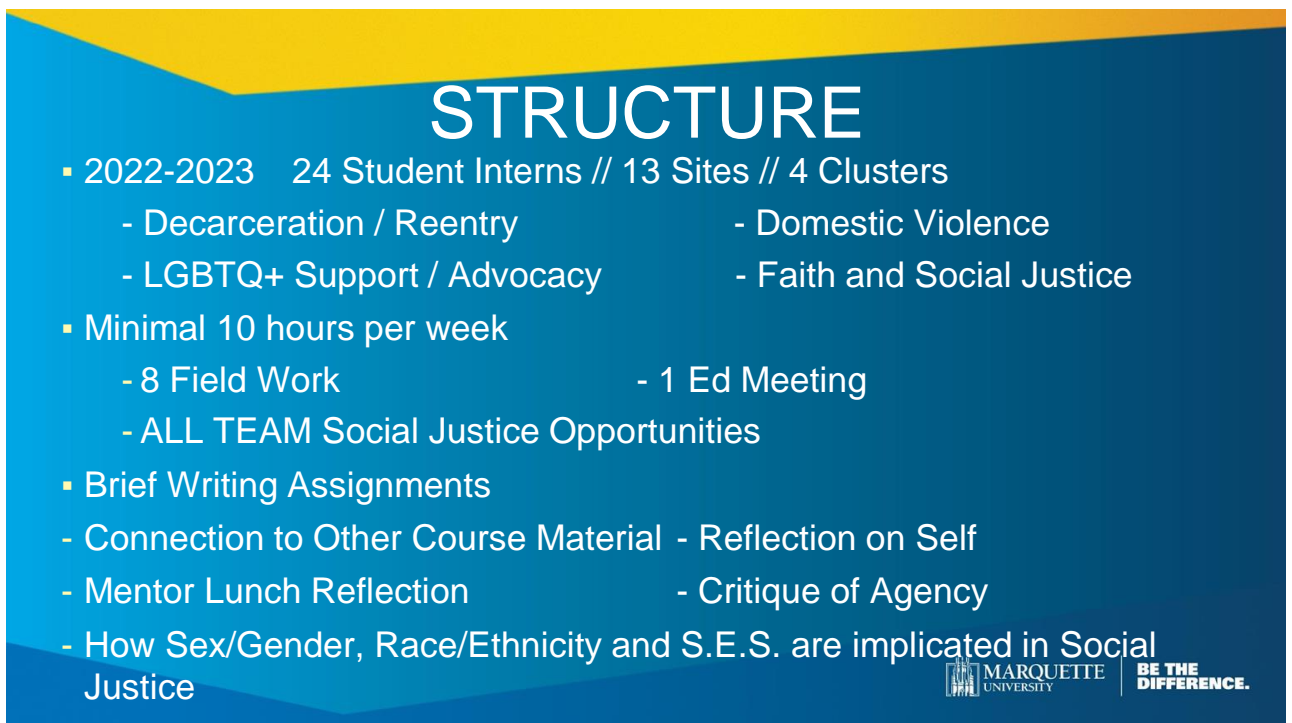
- PSYC 4964 Field Experience in Psychology
- 3 credits each for fall and spring semesters
 - 6 of the 9 psychology elective credits
 - Length = depth of experience and ability to meaningfully contribute to agency's mission
- Possible Stipend \$: 1) A&S Grants; 2) Eliana Winterbauer-Light Fund
- Information session in late February
- Application process prior to registration for fall

Student Responsibilities

- Report to work at the agreed-upon time, ready to work
- Attend to assigned duties on the job and not conduct personal business while at work
- Work with a cooperative and positive attitude
- Dress appropriately for the work setting
- Notify the supervisor as soon as possible if their work schedule changes
- Keep an accurate record of hours worked
- Notify supervisor of any job-related accident



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Site Responsibilities

- Provide educational experience that allows them to incorporate their academic learning in a professional setting
- Give mentorship and professional training experiences
- Report constructive feedback conducive to the student's learning
- Submit a brief evaluation of your experience
- Communicate clear expectations
- Facilitate regular supervision
